MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Dear PFLAGers:

To say that 2020 has been a year like no other would be an understatement. A global pandemic, continued racial injustice and righteous rage, the ongoing epidemic of violence and murder of transgender and nonbinary individuals, (especially Black transgender women), and a crucial election made 2020 a challenge on every front.

And yet, despite all of this, PFLAG National staff and our network of volunteer leaders from the PFLAG Chapter Network rose to the occasion, again and again, to meet these crises with creativity, passion, and heart.

Connection was key, and PFLAG staff moved quickly to ensure that our loved ones would always have a place to turn. PFLAG Connects, a new national program, was launched in five days, offering unprecedented access to digital tools and resources to make Support, Education, and Advocacy not only possible but stronger than ever before. Nearly half of our chapters are now taking advantage of PFLAG Connects' Zoom capabilities—provided at no charge to them (which will continue through 2021 and hopefully beyond). Feedback from chapter leaders tells us that this new program has been invaluable, helping to grow their chapters and deepen roots locally, as well as with others across the country.

We also saw chapter after chapter partner up to listen, learn, and lend their voices to demand an end to systemic racism and police brutality in their communities. Through this work, PFLAG is expanding into new communities, and we will continue that work so that PFLAG is a place where all families belong.

PFLAG Connects also made advocacy possible, as our team worked to beat back bad bills—and pass positive ones—across the country. From Texas to Ohio, Alaska to Pennsylvania, and other states

across the country, PFLAGers met with elected officials, state and federal virtually—to share their stories and move them to create more opportunities, and protections, for our LGBTQ+ loved ones.

Our Learning & Inclusion team launched Something to Talk About Live, a weekly broadcast discussing timely issues of diversity and inclusion, and thousands of people have been tuning in to join the discussion.

In service of the 2020 election, arguably one of the most important elections of our time, PFLAG National staff created PFLAG Votes 2020, a program that included a film series, newsletters with critical information, and a variety of online tools and resources in service of Voter Registration, Education, Mobilization, and Protection. PFLAGers turned out (virtually and in person, when able and safe to do so) to vote and help others do so—and with a record number of people voting across the country, we have an incoming administration that we believe will work tirelessly on behalf of our LGBTQ+ loved ones and their families. We are deeply grateful for the work PFLAG members and supporters did in service of the 2020 election.

We invite you to look at our Year in Review, which shares more data and details about all that was accomplished in 2020. Then, once you finish taking a look back, join us in focusing firmly on the future.

While our pillars of Support and Education are crucial mainstays of the work that we do, we must never forget that PFLAG's roots are grounded in Advocacy, starting in the streets of New York City with one committed mom with a handmade sign, seeking justice and equality for her gay son. One mom has grown to hundreds of thousands of parents, grandparents, siblings, and other committed allies, seeking justice for lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender,

nonbinary, and queer people of every race, ethnicity, faith, age, and disability.

Our advocacy—our calls for justice—must be firmly centered in the year ahead so that we can not only regain the losses of the last four years, but push past them for even bigger gains. That means working to pass the Equality Act; working to ban conversion therapy in every state across this country; and working to pass the Every Child Deserves a Family Act, so that LGBTQ+ people have the same opportunity to create families with children as their straight and cisgender counterparts. It means sharing our stories to change hearts and minds of legislators at every level of government, while also connecting with our friends, neighbors, colleagues, co-congregants, educators, and others so that as we pass laws we also move the conversation forward in our communities—because laws aren't enough, they are just one part of the work.

Let's gather, galvanize our PFLAG troops, and be ready to go. PFLAGers have never stopped fighting for what is right, and we know none of us will stop until we've achieved full equality in hearts, minds, and laws.

We know that these times have been especially tough on our families, but we want to thank you for everything you do to make the world a better place; you are the heart and soul of PFLAG.

The Year in Review


2020 was filled with challenge and difficulty for many of our LGBTQ+ loved ones and their families. While COVID-19 changed the world as we know it for all families, for our BIPOC loved ones, COVID only highlighted the danger and damage caused by centuries of racism and violence. PFLAG continued its commitment to inclusion, anti-racism work, and ending white supremacy in meaningful ways, including expanding the diversity of staff and leadership; investing in minority-owned institutions and businesses; creating intentional partnerships with BIPOC-led and centered organizations; and ensuring that learning opportunities were extended throughout the PFLAG Chapter Network.

While we are firmly focused on the year ahead, here is a snapshot of PFLAG National's work in 2020.

STAYING CONNECTED WITH THE PFLAG CHAPTER NETWORK

When COVID hit, PFLAG chapter leaders sprang to action, with the dedicated support of the Chapter Engagement Team. Taking advantage of PFLAG Connects' Zoom capabilities—free of charge—PFLAG chapters were able to connect in new and exciting ways, not only with their local communities, but with ANYONE across the country who was in need of immediate support and connection during this incredibly difficult year. They held virtual chapter meetings that opened PFLAG's doors to many who might not otherwise be able to attend, whether due to being too physically distant from meeting locations, timing of meetings conflicting with work schedules or family schedule constraints, or the need for childcare. PFLAG Connects allowed anyone, anywhere, to drop in for support when needed. It also provided fun opportunities like virtual Pride celebrations, streaming drag shows, game nights for teens, and more. The only constraint with PFLAG Connects is the creativity and drive of our chapter leaders and members—which is boundless!

Not even COVID stopped PFLAG's Advocacy and Policy shop, with virtual lobbying continuing at the state level, in partnership with PFLAG families in dozens of states. Whether it was testifying to defend our children against harmful anti-trans legislation in Florida, South Dakota, and Missouri, or sharing with lawmakers the importance of LGBTQ+ non-discrimination laws in Pennsylvania and Virginia, PFLAGers have been visible in every corner of the country, speaking with federal lawmakers from key states, including North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, and Texas, to advocate for the passage of federal anti-discrimination protections. There is nothing more powerful for a legislator to hear than a PFLAG story from a constituent. And this year, they were hearing from PFLAGers everywhere.

Even though many of us weren't with our moms or mothering loved ones to celebrate them in person, this event let us share something special, virtually.



YOU ARE MY PRIDE



Rooted in our commitment to human dignity, and to fighting discrimination, harassment, and violence against LGBTQ+ people and all marginalized communities, PFLAG partnered with Wear Your Voice on #YouAreMyPride, launched in June 2020. This project uplifted and affirmed our LGBTQ+ BIPOC loved ones, whose courage, beauty, voice, and experience has always led on Pride and the fight for justice.

#PROUDPARENT

The #ProudParent film was part of our yearlong partnership with OREO, aimed at empowering and inspiring parents, families, and allies of LGBTQ+ folks to come out in loud, public support. Because every time a parent comes out in support of their child they inspire others to do the same making the world a more accepting, affirming, and compassionate place. The film launched on the PFLAG website and social media. To date. there have been 35 million views of the video and 315 million views of the overall campaign. #ProudParent also included education guides as a companion resource for the project and—most notably—the #ProudParent rainbow Oreo giveaway.

The four-minute film and its accompanying mini-videos—which delve more deeply into the stories of each family—are directed by award-winner Oceano, who previously directed the short film, LAS FAMILIAS DE PFLAG EN ESPAÑOL for PFLAG National. PFLAG VOTES features PFLAG families from communities across the country, representing a diverse spectrum of voters. How To Stand Up for Your Kid When Society Won't: A mom learns to embrace her child's nonbinary identity

"Karin always thought of herself as the mom of two boys—that is, until last year when her oldest child told her they were nonbinary, meaning they don't identify as either male or female. Karin loves her kid deeply, but she's struggling to get used to their new name and pronouns, especially because her town—and husband aren't very accepting. On this episode of How To!, we bring in Lisa DelCol, a fellow mom of a nonbinary child and former president of PFLAG Oklahoma City, to help Karin come to terms with her child's gender identity. Parents are going to make mistakes along the way, Lisa says, but it's important to share what you learn with others. The more you advocate for them, the more accepting the world becomes."




