GOTV in Delaware

First things first

Register to vote:

- Go to: vote411.org/pflag
 - Check your registration status
 - If you are not registered REGISTER NOW.
 - Find information about who is eligible to vote in Delaware
- When you register you will be asked for your current address and ID Number (driver's license, state ID, or social security number).
- The voter registration deadline in Delaware is October 12.





Voter Identification

In Delaware, identification is requested to cast a ballot.

- If you're unable to provide valid proof of identity, you may complete an Affidavit of Voter Identity. You will then be permitted to vote.

Voting While Trans/Nonbinary

The state of Delaware does not provide any specific guidance for trans and nonbinary voters. Here are a few recommendations from Advocates for Trans Equality:

- Bring valid ID and backups (voter registration card, utility bill)
- Share the #VotingWhileTrans guide with poll workers
- If needed, connect with a volunteer attorney on-site or call the National Election Protection Hotline (866-OUR-VOTE)
- Worst case, request and cast a provisional ballot and be sure to ask for follow-up instructions





Voting While Living With a Disability

- All polling places must be accessible to people with disabilities. You may vote by absentee ballot, in person during Early Voting, or in person on Election Day.
- You can ask for help with operating the voting machine. You can ask poll workers or any other
 person you choose to assist you (except for your employer or union).
- All Delaware voting machines are accessible to all voters. The Universal Voting Console (UVC)
 is a headset and handheld device that allows you to vote unassisted.
- Delaware does not offer curbside voting.

Absentee voting or voting by mail

Vote by mail.

- Delaware requires an excuse for absentee voting. Valid excuses include:
 - You're temporarily outside of the territorial limits of the US or Delaware
 - You cannot appear at your polling place "due to the nature of my business or occupation"
 - You're sick or physically disabled
 - You're unable to vote at a certain time because the tenets of your religion





Absentee voting or voting by mail

Vote by mail.

- Voters must request their absentee ballot by November 1.
- In Delaware an absentee ballot must be received by 8pm on November 5.
- You can request an absentee ballot here: <u>ivote.de.gov/VoterView</u>.
- Your absentee ballot can be hand delivered on election day to a local election office or a drop box. You cannot turn it in at your polling place.





PFLAG recommends that voters request their absentee ballots as soon as possible and get them in the mailbox no later than Tuesday, October 22.

Early voting

Vote early.

- All registered voters in Delaware can vote early for any reason.

- Early voting in Delaware is open October 25-29 (11 am 7 pm) and October 30–November 3 (7 am–7 pm)
- Voters who plan to vote early in Delaware are required to have identification. Learn more here: <u>delaware.gov/guides/</u> <u>voting-in-delaware/</u>





Voting on Election Day:

Vote on election day.

- Polls open in Delaware at 7am and close at 8pm on Tuesday, November 5.
- You can find information about the location of your polling place here: vote411.org/pflag
- If you arrive and are told you won't be allowed to vote:
 - Don't panic. Ask why, fix any problems, ask about same day registration, request a provisional ballot, etc.
 - Call 866-OUR-VOTE or 888-VE-Y-VOTA.





If you are in line to vote when the polls close, STAY IN LINE.
