First things first

Register to vote:

- Go to: vote411.org/pflag
 - Check your registration status
 - If you are not registered – REGISTER NOW.
 - Find information about who is eligible to vote in Kentucky
- When you register you will be asked for your current address and ID Number (driver's license, state ID, or social security number).
- The voter registration deadline in Kentucky is **October 7**.



Voter Identification

In Kentucky, photo IDs are required to cast a ballot.

- If you do not present a valid ID, you can cast a provisional ballot. You must provide valid ID to your county clerk's office in order for your ballot to be counted.

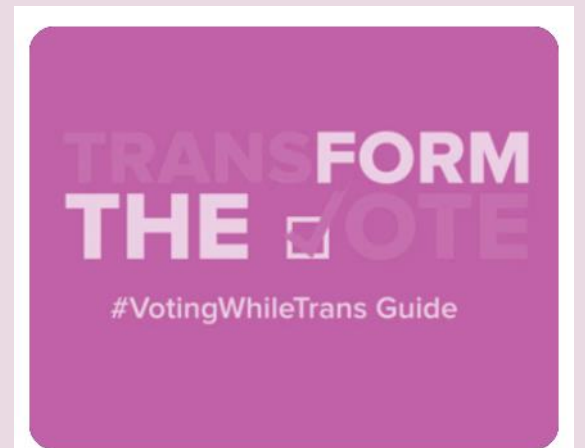

Voting While Trans/Nonbinary

The state of Kentucky does not provide any specific guidance for trans and nonbinary voters. Here are a few recommendations from Advocates for Trans Equality:

- Bring valid ID and backups (voter registration card, utility bill)
- Share the #VotingWhileTrans guide with poll workers
- If needed, connect with a volunteer attorney on-site or call the National Election Protection Hotline (866-OUR-VOTE)
- Worst case, request and cast a provisional ballot and be sure to ask for follow-up instructions



TRANSform the Vote

Voting While Living With a Disability

- You can vote by mail with an absentee ballot if you have a disability.
- You may request access to the "Disability Absentee Portal" to access your ballot. It must be printed and returned to the County Clerk's office by mail or in person.
- All polling places are ADA compliant and will have at least one ADA approved voting machine.
- You can have assistance voting from a companion or election worker.
- Curbside voting is not available.

Absentee voting or voting by mail

Vote by mail.

- Kentucky requires an excuse for absentee voting by mail. Excuses differ depending on where the ballot will be mailed.
- If you want a ballot mailed to your residential address:
 - You must be prevented from voting in person due to being out of town
 - You're not able to appear at the polls due to age, disability, or illness
 - You're a participant in the Secretary of State's crime victim address confidentiality protection program



Absentee voting or voting by mail

Vote by mail.

- If you want a ballot mailed to a mailing address different than your residential address you must be:
 - A military or overseas voter
 - A student who temporarily resides outside of their county of residence
 - A person who is incarcerated in jail, but not yet convicted of a crime
 - Temporarily residing outside the state but still eligible to vote in KY
 - If you've moved to a new state after their registration period has ended. You will only be able to vote for President and Vice President.



Absentee voting or voting by mail

Vote by mail.

- Voters must request their absentee ballot by October 22.
- In Kentucky, an absentee ballot must be received by November 5 at 6pm.
- You can request an absentee ballot here: vrsws.sos.ky.gov/abrweb/.
- Your absentee ballot cannot be delivered to your polling place on election day. You must return it using a drop box or at a local election office.

PFLAG recommends that voters request their absentee ballots as soon as possible and get them in the mailbox no later than Tuesday, October 22.

Early voting

Vote early.

- Any registered voter who has not requested a mail-in ballot and who has a valid excuse can vote early in person October 23-30, 2024.
- Any registered voter who has not requested a mail-in ballot can vote early in-person without an excuse October 31 – November 2, 2024.

In most cases, you must be unable to vote in person during ALL polling hours during early voting and on election day to be eligible to vote by mail or vote early.


Getting Out The Vote

Voting on Election Day:

Vote on election day.

- Polls open in Kentucky at 6am and close at 6pm on Tuesday, November 5.
- You can find information about the location of your polling place here:

- If you arrive and are told you won't be allowed to vote:
 - Don't panic. Ask why, fix any problems, ask about same day registration, request a provisional ballot, etc.
 - Call 866-OUR-VOTE or 888-VE-Y-VOTA.
