First things first

Register to vote:

- Go to: vote411.org/pflag
 - Check your registration status
 - If you are not registered – REGISTER NOW.
 - Find information about who is eligible to vote in Nebraska
- When you register you will be asked for your current address and ID Number (driver's license, state ID, or social security number).
- The voter registration deadline in Nebraska is **October 18**. Mailed applications must be postmarked by the 18th and received by October 25.



Voter Identification

In Nebraska, photo IDs are now required to cast a ballot.

- If you do not have a state ID, you may obtain a free state ID for voting purposes from the Nebraska DMV. You can also receive a free copy of your Nebraska birth certificate if you need it to obtain a free state ID.

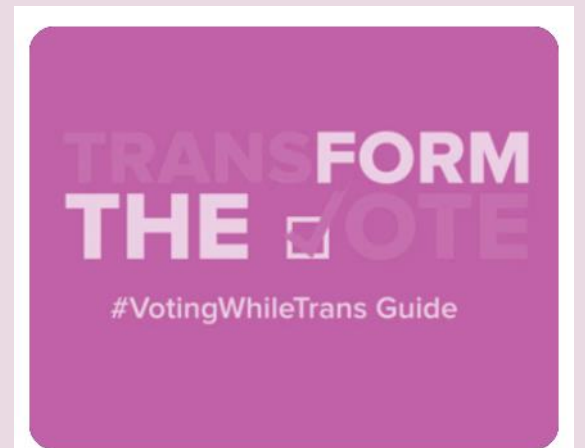

Voting While Trans/Nonbinary

The state of Nebraska does not provide any specific guidance for trans and nonbinary voters. Here are a few recommendations from Advocates for Trans Equality:

- Bring valid ID and backups (voter registration card, utility bill)
- Share the #VotingWhileTrans guide with poll workers
- If needed, connect with a volunteer attorney on-site or call the National Election Protection Hotline (866-OUR-VOTE)
- Worst case, request and cast a provisional ballot and be sure to ask for follow-up instructions

Voting While Living With a Disability

- Every polling place will have an "ExpressVote," which offers audio, zoom, multi-language capability, and sip and puff compatibility.
- All polling places will have an accessible parking area, walkway and interior.
- If you need to sit, you can request a chair.
- Curbside voting is available.
- You can request assistance from an election worker, or from a support person of your choice. The person cannot be your employer or union representative.

Absentee voting or voting by mail

Vote by mail.

- Nebraska doesn't require an excuse for absentee voting.
- Voters must request their absentee ballot by October 25.
- In Nebraska an absentee ballot must be received by 7 pm MT/8 pm CT on November 5.
- You can print an absentee ballot request application here:

- Your absentee ballot cannot be hand delivered to your polling place on election day. It must be mailed, placed in a drop box, or returned to the county election official's office.



PFLAG recommends that voters request their absentee ballots as soon as possible and get them in the mailbox no later than Tuesday, October 22.

Early voting

Vote early.

- All registered voters in Nebraska can vote early for any reason.
- You can vote early at your county election offices. You can find information about early voting locations in Nebraska here: vote411.org/pflag
- Early voting begins in Nebraska on October 7 and ends on November 4.
- Voters who plan to vote early in Nebraska are required to have identification. Learn more here: sos.nebraska.gov/elections/voter-id




Getting Out The Vote

Voting on Election Day:

Vote on election day.

- Polls open in Nebraska at 7amMT/8amCT and close at 7amMT/8amCT on Tuesday, November 5.
- You can find information about the location of your polling place here:
vote411.org/pflag
- If you arrive and are told you won't be allowed to vote:
 - Don't panic. Ask why, fix any problems, ask about same day registration, request a provisional ballot, etc.
 - Call 866-OUR-VOTE or 888-VE-Y-VOTA.
