

First things first

Register to vote:

- Go to: vote411.org/pflag
 - Check your registration status
 - If you are not registered REGISTER NOW.
 - Find information about who is eligible to vote in Pennsylvania
- When you register you will be asked for your current address and ID Number (driver's license, state ID, or social security number).
- The voter registration deadline in Pennsylvania is October 21.






Voter Identification

In Pennsylvania, identification is not required to cast a ballot UNLESS it's your first time voting at a new polling place.

- If you do not have photo ID, you can use other ID that include your name and address, including a current utility bill or bank statement.

Voting While Trans/Nonbinary

The state of Pennsylvania does not provide any specific guidance for trans and nonbinary voters. Here are a few recommendations from Advocates for Trans Equality:

- Bring valid ID and backups (voter registration card, utility bill)
- Share the #VotingWhileTrans guide with poll workers
- If needed, connect with a volunteer attorney on-site or call the National Election Protection Hotline (866-OUR-VOTE)
- Worst case, request and cast a provisional ballot and be sure to ask for follow-up instructions

Voting While Living With a Disability

- Every polling place will have at least one accessible voting machine. You can find what kind of machine your county uses here: <u>pa.gov/en/agencies/vote/voter-support/voting-systemdemos.html</u>
- If you are over 65 years old or have a disability, and your polling place is not accessible, you
 may be able to vote an alternative ballot by mail. More information on alternative ballots

- Curbside voting is not available.



Absentee voting or voting by mail

Vote by mail.

- Pennsylvania does not require an excuse to vote by mail. Voters who will be out of their municipality or have a disability may still request an absentee ballot.
- The deadline to request a mail-in or absentee ballot is 5pm on October 29.

Absentee voting or voting by mail

Vote by mail.

- In Pennsylvania, an absentee ballot must be received by 8 pm on November 5.
- Voters must return their own ballot. (Voters with disabilities may have someone return their ballot, if they designated that person in writing on the ballot.)
- Your absentee ballot cannot be hand delivered to your polling place on election day. You must return it via mail, at a drop box, or at your county election office.

PFLAG recommends that voters request their absentee ballots as soon as possible and get them in the mailbox no later than Tuesday, October 22.

Getting Out The Vote

Early Voting

Vote early.

- All registered voters in Pennsylvania can vote early for any reason.
- You can find information about early voting locations in Pennsylvania here: vote411.org/pflag
- Early voting begins in Pennsylvania on September 16 and ends on October 29.





Voting on Election Day:

Vote on election day.

- Polls open in Pennsylvania at 7am and close at 8pm on Tuesday, November 5.
- You can find information about the location of your polling place here: vote411.org/pflag
- If you arrive and are told you won't be allowed to vote:
 - Don't panic. Ask why, fix any problems, ask about same day registration, request a provisional ballot, etc.
 - Call 866-OUR-VOTE or 888-VE-Y-VOTA.





If you are in line to vote when the polls close, STAY IN LINE.
