## GOTW in Utah

## First things first

#### Register to vote.

- Go to: vote411.org/pflag
  - Check your registration status
  - If you are not registered REGISTER NOW.
  - Find information about who is eligible to vote in Utah
- When you register online you will be asked for your current address and ID Number (driver's license, state ID, or social security number).
- The voter registration deadline in Utah is October 25.





## You can register to vote in-person at your voting center on Election Day in Utah.

## Voter Identification

In Utah, photo IDs are required to cast a ballot.

- If registering to vote on election day, you'll need to provide two acceptable forms of ID. One will verify identity and the other will verify residence.



## **Voting While Trans/Nonbinary**

The state of Utah does not provide any specific guidance for trans and nonbinary voters. Here are a few recommendations from Advocates for Trans Equality:

- Bring valid ID and backups (voter registration card, utility bill)
- Share the #VotingWhileTrans guide with poll workers
- If needed, connect with a volunteer attorney on-site or call the National Election Protection Hotline (866-OUR-VOTE)
- Worst case, request and cast a provisional ballot and be sure to ask for follow-up instructions





## Voting While Living With a Disability

- You can vote by mail ballot or via email or fax. You may request an email or fax ballot through your county clerk's office.
- All voting locations will be wheelchair accessible and offer at least accessible voting machine. The machines offer accommodations for voters who have visual or hearing disabilities.
- Curbside voting is not available.

## Absentee voting or voting by mail

#### Vote by mail.

- All registered voters in Utah will automatically receive a ballot in the mail.
- In Utah, an absentee ballot must be postmarked by November 4. You can also return the ballots to drop boxes until 8pm on November 5.
- Your absentee ballot cannot be hand delivered to a voting center on election day. You must return it via mail or drop box.

PFLAG recommends that voters complete their absentee ballots as soon as possible and get them in the mailbox no later than Tuesday, October 22.

## **Early Voting**

#### Vote early.

- All registered voters in Utah can vote early for any reason.
- You can find information about early voting locations in Utah here: vote411.org/pflag
- Early voting begins between October 22 and October 29. Contact your county clerk for specific dates, hours, and locations: <a href="mailto:vote.utah.gov/county-clerk-contact-information/">vote.utah.gov/county-clerk-contact-information/</a>.
- Voters who plan to vote early in Utah are required to have identification.

## **Voting on Election Day:**

#### Vote on election day.

- Polls open in Utah at 7am and close at 8pm on Tuesday, November 5.

- If you arrive and are told you won't be allowed to vote:
  - Don't panic. Ask why, fix any problems, ask about same day registration, request a provisional ballot, etc.
  - Call 866-OUR-VOTE or 888-VE-Y-VOTA.
