GOTV in Virginia

First things first

Register to vote.

- Go to: vote411.org/pflag
 - Check your registration status
 - If you are not registered REGISTER NOW.
 - Find information about who is eligible to vote in Virginia
- When you register online you will be asked for your current address and ID Number (driver's license, state ID, or social security number).
- The voter registration deadline in Virginia is October 15.





Voter Identification

In Virginia, identification is requested to cast a ballot.

- If you do not present acceptable identification, you may sign an affidavit claiming you are who you say you are.
- If you do not present acceptable identification, and you do not sign an affidavit, you can vote a provisional ballot.



Voting While Trans/Nonbinary

The state of Virginia does not provide any specific guidance for trans and nonbinary voters. Here are a few recommendations from Advocates for Trans Equality:

- Bring valid ID and backups (voter registration card, utility bill)
- Share the #VotingWhileTrans guide with poll workers
- If needed, connect with a volunteer attorney on-site or call the National Election Protection Hotline (866-OUR-VOTE)
- Worst case, request and cast a provisional ballot and be sure to ask for follow-up instructions





Voting While Living With a Disability

- If you have a print disability, you may request to receive an accessible electronic absentee ballot. Your ballot will be delivered via email and can be marked using screen reader assistive technology.
- You may request to be listed on the permanent absentee list here: <u>vote.elections.virginia.gov/VoterInformation</u>
- Each polling place will have at least one accessible voting machine with a chair and will have an accessible parking lot. Notepads to communicate in writing and magnifiers will be available.
- Curbside voting is available if you have a disability or are over the age of 65. If you'd like to vote curbside, park in the designated parking space at the polling location.

Absentee voting or voting by mail

Vote by mail.

- Virginia does not require an excuse for absentee voting.
- Voters must request their absentee ballot by October 25.
- You can request an absentee ballot here: <u>vote.elections.virginia.gov/VoterInformation</u>.
- In Virginia, an absentee ballot must be received by November 5 if dropping it off in person. If returning by mail, the ballot must be postmarked by November 5 and received by 12pm on November 8.
- Your absentee ballot cannot be hand delivered to your polling place on election day. You must return it via mail, at a drop box, or hand delivered to your local general registrar's office.





PFLAG recommends that voters request their absentee ballots as soon as possible and get them in the mailbox no later than Tuesday, October 22.

Early Voting

Vote early.

- All registered voters in Virginia can vote early for any reason.

- Early voting begins in Virginia on September 20 and ends on November 2.
- Voters who plan to vote early in Virginia are required to have identification.

Voting on Election Day:

Vote on election day.

- Polls open in Virginia at 6am and close at 7pm on Tuesday, November 5.
- You can find information about the location of your polling place here:

- If you arrive and are told you won't be allowed to vote:
 - Don't panic. Ask why, fix any problems, ask about same day registration, request a provisional ballot, etc.
 - Call 866-OUR-VOTE or 888-VE-Y-VOTA.
