

Get Out the Vote in Alabama



The voter registration deadline in Alabama, for the November 2024 election, is Monday, October 21.



ID Requirements

In Alabama, photo ID (e.g., driver license, military ID, passport) is required to register and cast a ballot. Voters who do not have a photo ID may cast a provisional ballot.

Absentee Voting

Voters in Alabama need a valid excuse to vote absentee.

They must request their ballot by Tuesday, October 29 (by mail) or Thursday, October 31 (in-person).

Absentee ballots must be received by 5 pm Monday, November 4, if dropping off in-person, and by 12 pm Tuesday, November 5 if returning by mail.

Alabama requires that your signature be witnessed by a notary public OR by two witnesses who are 18 years of age or older. Electronic notarization is not permitted.

Alabama does not offer early in person voting.
All early voting must be done via absentee ballot.

November 5.

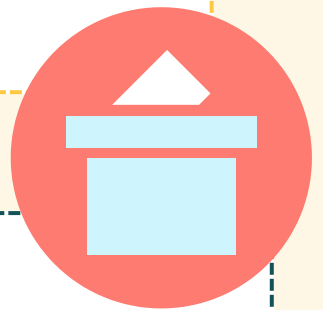
