Get Out the Vote in Alaska



The voter registration deadline in Alaska, for the November 2024 election, is Sunday, October 6.

ID Requirements

In Alaska, photo ID (e.g., driver license, military ID) is required to register and cast a ballot. Voters who do not have a photo ID may vote by providing a current utility bill or paycheck that contains their current residential address.

Absentee Voting

Alaska does not require an excuse to vote absentee.

Voters must request their ballot by Saturday, October 26.

Absentee ballots must be postmarked by Tuesday, November 5 and received by Friday, November 15 if returning by mail. Absentee ballots must be received by Tuesday, November 5 if returning in-person.

Alaska requires your signature on your absentee ballot be witnessed by someone 18 years of age or older. They must also sign the return ballot envelope and provide at least one identifier.
