Get Out the Vote in Hawaii



The voter registration deadline in Hawaii, for the November 2024 election, is Monday, October 28.

ID Requirements

In Hawaii, photo ID is not required to register and cast a ballot. Voters must provide some form of identification (e.g. social security number, utility bill, paycheck) when registering to vote.

Absentee Voting

All registered voters will automatically receive a mail ballot on approximately Friday, October 18. You only need to request an absentee ballot if you need it mailed to a temporary mailing address.

Absentee ballots must be received by 7 pm on Tuesday, November 5.

Your absentee ballot can be returned in person at a voter service center or drop box. You can find locations here: elections.hawaii.gov/voter-service-centers-andplaces-of-deposit/

PFLAG recommends that voters get their ballots in the mailbox no later than Tuesday, October 22.

If you are in line to vote on election day when the polls close – STAY IN LINE. You must be allowed to cast your ballot.

Early Voting

All registered voters in Hawaii can vote early for any reason. Early voting begins on Tuesday, October 22 and ends on Monday, November 4.

Voting on Election Day

Polls open in Hawaii at 7 am and close at 7 pm on Tuesday, November 5.
