The voter registration deadline in Kansas, for the November 2024 election, is Tuesday, October 15.

ID Requirements

In Kansas, photo ID (e.g., driver license, military ID, passport) is required to cast a ballot. Voters who do not have a photo ID can apply for a free non-driver identification card with the Kansas DMV.

Absentee Voting

Kansas does not require an excuse for absentee voting.

Voters must request their absentee ballot by Tuesday, October 29.

Absentee ballots must be received by Tuesday, November 5, if dropping off inperson. Ballots must be postmarked by Tuesday, November 5 and received by Friday, November 8 if returning by mail.

Your absentee ballot can be hand delivered on election day.

If you are in line to vote on election day when the polls close – STAY IN LINE. You must be allowed to cast your ballot.

Early Voting

All registered voters in Kansas can vote early for any reason. Early voting locations must open by Tuesday, October 29 and all locations close at 12 pm on Monday, November 4. Some counties begin voting as early as Wednesday, October 16.

Voting on Election Day

Most polls open in Kansas at 7 am and close at 7 pm on Tuesday, November 5.
