

Get Out the Vote in Michigan



The voter registration deadline in Michigan, for the November 2024 election, is Monday, October 21.



ID Requirements

In Michigan, photo ID is not required to register and cast a ballot, unless you possess a photo ID on your person at the time of voting. If you do not have a photo ID, you can sign an affidavit and cast a regular ballot.

Absentee Voting

Michigan does not require an excuse for absentee voting.

Voters must request their absentee ballot by 5 pm on Friday, November 1 (online or by mail) or by 4 pm on Monday, November 4 (in-person).

Absentee ballots must be received by 8 pm on Tuesday, November 5.

Your absentee ballot cannot be hand delivered on election day. You can return them by mail, drop box, at an early voting site, or at a city or township clerk's office.

Early Voting

All registered voters in Michigan can vote early for any reason. Early voting begins on Saturday, October 26 and ends on Sunday, November 3. Some counties may begin early voting earlier.

Voting on Election Day

Polls open in Michigan at 7 am and close at 8 pm on Tuesday, November 5.

You can register to vote on election day in Michigan, but not at your polling place. You must go to your city or township clerk's office to register and cast your ballot.
