Get Out the Vote in Mississippi



The voter registration deadline in Mississippi, for the November 2024 election, is Monday, October 7.

ID Requirements

In Mississippi, photo ID (e.g., driver license, military ID, passport) is required to register and cast a ballot. Voters who do not have a photo ID can vote by affidavit ballot. If you do not have a photo ID, you can also get a free voter ID card at any circuit clerk's office.

Absentee Voting

Voters in Mississippi with a valid excuse may vote absentee.

They must request their ballot by Monday, November 4.

Absentee ballots must be postmarked by Tuesday, November 5 and received by Wednesday, November 13 if returning by mail. Ballot must be received by Tuesday, November 5 if returning in person.

You must complete your absentee ballot in front of an authorized witness, most often a notary.

Your absentee ballot cannot be hand delivered on election day.

If you are in line to vote on election day when the polls close – STAY IN LINE.
You must be allowed to cast your ballot.

Early Voting

A valid excuse is required to vote early in Mississippi. Early voting begins on Monday, September 23 and ends on Saturday, November 2.

Voting on Election Day

Polls open in Mississippi at 7 am and close at 7 pm on Tuesday, November 5.
