Get Out the Vote in North Carolina



The voter registration deadline in North Carolina, for the November 2024 election, is Friday, October 11.

ID Requirements

In North Carolina, photo ID (e.g., driver license, military ID, passport) is required to cast a ballot. If you do not have an acceptable photo ID, you can vote a provisional ballot and return to your county board of election office with photo ID before Thursday, November 14.

Absentee Voting

North Carolina does not require an excuse for absentee voting.

Voters must request their ballot by Tuesday, October 29.

Absentee ballots must be received by 7:30 pm on Tuesday, November 5.

Your absentee ballot cannot be hand delivered to a polling place on election day. You must return it via mail, in person at your county elections office, or at an early voting site in your county.

PFLAG recommends that voters request their absentee ballots as soon as possible and get them in the mailbox no later than Tuesday, October 22.

You must be allowed to cast your ballot.

Early Voting

All registered voters in North Carolina can vote early for any reason. Early voting begins on Thursday, October 17 and ends on Saturday, November 2. Same day registration is available at all early voting sites.

Voting on Election Day

Polls open in North Carolina at 6:30 am and close at 7:30 pm on Tuesday, November 5.
