Get Out the Vote in North Dakota



North Dakota does not have voter registration.

ID Requirements

In North Dakota, photo ID (e.g., driver license, military ID, passport) is required to cast a ballot. Non-driver photo IDs are available at the North Dakota Department of Transportation for no cost.

Absentee Voting

North Dakota does not require an excuse for absentee voting.

Voters must request their absentee ballot by Monday, November 4.

You can request an absentee ballot here: vip.sos.nd.gov/absentee/Default.aspx

Absentee ballots must be postmarked by Monday, November 4.

Your absentee ballot cannot be hand delivered to your polling place on election day. Ballots must be returned by mail, in person to your appropriate election official, or to a drop box by 5 pm on Monday, November 4.

PFLAG recommends that voters request their absentee ballots as soon as possible and get them in the mailbox no later than Tuesday, October 22.

If you are in line to vote on election day when the polls close – STAY IN LINE.
You must be allowed to cast your ballot.

Early Voting

All registered voters in North Dakota can vote early for any reason, if their county offers early voting. Early voting dates vary by county.

Voting on Election Day

Polls open in North Dakota between 7 am and 9 am and close between 7 pm and 9 pm on Tuesday, November 5.
