Get Out the Vote in Ohio



The voter registration deadline in Ohio, for the November 2024 election, is Monday, October 7.

ID Requirements

In Ohio, photo ID (e.g., driver license, military ID, passport) is required to cast a ballot. Voters who do not have a photo ID may cast a provisional ballot and provide an acceptable photo no later than Saturday, November 9.

Absentee Voting

Ohio does not require an excuse for absentee voting.

Voters must request their absentee ballot by Tuesday, October 29.

Absentee ballots must be received by 7:30 pm on Tuesday, November 5 if returning in person. If returning by mail, ballots must be postmarked by Monday, November 4 and received by Saturday, November 9.

Your absentee ballot cannot be hand delivered to your polling place on election day. You must mail it or return it in person to your county elections office.

If you are in line to vote on election day when the polls close – STAY IN LINE. You must be allowed to cast your ballot.

Early Voting

All registered voters in Ohio can vote early for any reason. Early voting begins on Tuesday, October 8 and ends on Sunday, November 3.

Voting on Election Day

Polls open in Ohio at 6:30 am and close at 7:30 pm on Tuesday, November 5.
