Get Out the Vote in Texas



The voter registration deadline in Texas, for the November 2024 election, is Monday, October 7.

ID Requirements

In Texas, photo ID (e.g., driver license, military ID, passport) is required to register and cast a ballot. Voters who do not have a photo ID can vote if they provide supporting ID, such as a utility bill, and complete a Reasonable Impediment Declaration.

Absentee Voting

Voters in Texas with a valid excuse can vote by absentee ballot.

Voters must request their ballot by Friday, October 25.

Voters can request an absentee ballot here: votetexas.gov

Absentee ballots must be postmarked by 7 pm on Tuesday, November 5 and received by 5 pm on Wednesday, November 6.

Your absentee ballot can be hand delivered to your polling place on election day.

PFLAG recommends that voters request their absentee ballots as soon as possible and get them in the mailbox no later than Tuesday, October 22.

If you are in line to vote on election day when the polls close – STAY IN LINE. You must be allowed to cast your ballot.

Early Voting

All registered voters in Texas can vote early for any reason. Early voting begins on Monday, October 21 and ends on Friday, November 1.

Voting on Election Day

Polls open in Texas at 7 am and close at 7 pm on Tuesday, November 5.
