Get Out the Vote in Wisconsin



The voter registration deadline in Wisconsin, for the November 2024 election, is Wednesday, October 16.

ID Requirements

In Wisconsin, photo ID (e.g., driver license, military ID, passport) is required to cast a ballot. If you do not have a photo ID, you can get a free state ID card. The name on your ID doesn't need to be an exact match to your name in the poll book (e.g., "Bob" instead of "Robert" is acceptable).

Absentee Voting

Wisconsin does not require an excuse for absentee voting.

Voters must request their ballot by Thursday, October 31.

Absentee ballots must be received by 8 pm on Tuesday, November 5.

Your absentee ballot can be hand delivered to your polling place on election day.

You must be allowed to cast your ballot.
