





Sample Ground Rules

Think of ground rules as the compass guiding your chapter's meetings - they help ensure everyone feels heard, included, and respected and can help provide ground rules to all types of chapter meetings, beyond support. It's all about creating a safe space that works for everyone. Here are a few suggestions for these rules, but feel free to tweak them to best fit your group's needs:

- This is a safe space
 - o Be honest about your feelings and thoughts
 - Use "I" statements to express your feelings, not your opinions
- Respect confidentiality
 - Take the stories, leave the details
 - Check with people before approaching them in public
- Share the air
 - Keep your comments relevant so everyone can participate
 - o Take space, make space.
- Listen generously
 - Listen for what people are saying, not to respond.
 - Don't interrupt.
- Silence electronics, don't record the meeting
 - Please step out if you must take a call
 - o This is a community centered space, thanks for remaining present without electronics
- Demonstrate respect for cultural differences and diversity of views.
 - No one is better than another we are all equal with different perspectives and lenses.
 - o Everyone is welcome here, as long as people are respectful and kind to one another

After sharing these rules, ask for agreement - ask attendees to say "yes" or raise their hand. Some chapters incorporate this process into their pre-meeting registration. It's always okay if someone has an additional suggestion, hear what they have to say and let the group decide if they want to adopt the suggestion.
