

Demystifying the Legislative Process


## At all levels of government...

After a policy or bill has been designed and drafted, it is introduced to the entire voting body or assembly. Before they are voted on:

- Bills are assigned to the appropriate committee(s) that are devoted to the issue(s) or topic area(s) the bill would address
- In committee, bills can be voted on as is, debated, changed, amended, or killed all together
- If a bill is approved by the committee, it will go the full assembly for a vote



## How a bill becomes a law

### How to take action

#### When the bill is introduced:

• Tell your representative where you stand on the issue as a voter they represent by phone, handwritten letter, email, fax, etc.

#### While the bill is in committee:

- Contact members of the committee asking them to support or oppose the bill
- Testify in committee





### How to take action

#### During floor votes (2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> reading):

Tell your representative to vote for or against the bill

#### When the executive branch receives a bill after it has passed:

- Contact them with an ask to sign or veto it
- Meet with the chief executive (or their office) to share your story and make your ask





## Something to consider...

Just because a bill is filed, does not mean it will receive a hearing or move through the legislative process.

- A lot goes into determining which bills are heard and which are not such as which committee it is assigned to, who the bill author is, the caucus' legislative priorities, etc.
- Sometimes shedding too much light on a piece of legislation can do more harm than good.
- It is important to check in with your state equality group or PFLAG National when considering taking action on a piece of legislation.




