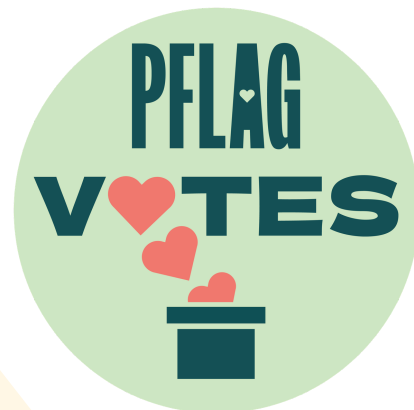




Get Out the Vote in Arizona



**The voter registration deadline in Arizona,
for the November 2026 election,
is Monday, October 5.**



ID Requirements

In Arizona, photo ID (e.g., driver license, military ID, passport) and proof of citizenship is required to register to vote. Photo ID is required to and cast a ballot. Two forms of ID without a photo, that include your name and address, can fulfill the ID requirement at the polls.

Absentee Voting

Arizona does not require an excuse for absentee voting.

Voters must request their ballot by Friday, October 23.

Absentee ballots must be received by 7 pm on Tuesday, November 3.

Absentee ballots can be hand-delivered to your country election office or to a drop box.

Early Voting

All registered voters in Arizona can vote early for any reason. Early voting begins in Arizona on Wednesday, October 7 and ends on Friday, October 30.

Voting on Election Day

Polls open in Arizona at 6 am and close at 7 pm on Tuesday, November 3.

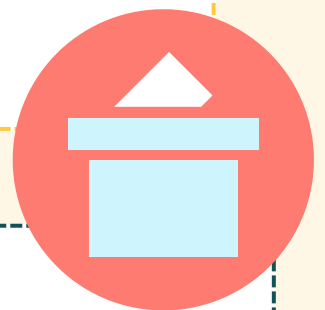
You can find information about the location of your polling place on the website for your county's Election Official. Maricopa and Pima counties maintain their own polling place locators.
