First things first

Register to vote:

- Go to: vote411.org/pflag
 - Check your registration status
 - If you are not registered – REGISTER NOW.
 - Find information about who is eligible to vote in Georgia
- When you register you will be asked for your current address and ID Number (driver's license, state ID, or social security number).
- The voter registration deadline in Georgia is October 5.



Voter Identification

In Georgia, photo IDs are required to register and cast an in person or absentee ballot.

- An ID card can be issued at any county registrar's office or Department of Driver Services Office free of charge.

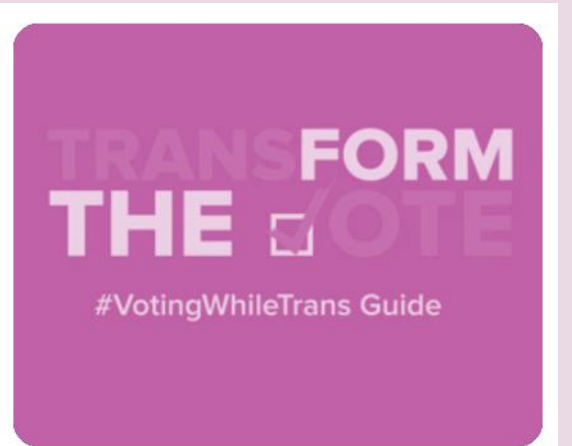

Voting While Trans/Nonbinary

The state of Georgia does not provide any specific guidance for trans and nonbinary voters. Here are a few recommendations from Advocates for Trans Equality:

- Bring valid ID and backups (voter registration card, utility bill)
- Share the #VotingWhileTrans guide with poll workers
- If needed, connect with a volunteer attorney on-site or call the National Election Protection Hotline (866-OUR-VOTE)
- Worst case, request and cast a provisional ballot and be sure to ask for follow-up instructions

Voting While Living With a Disability

- Georgia uses a paper ballot voting system that can accommodate people with various disabilities. Headsets are available, and large controls that can accommodate sip-and-puff devices are available. You can use an app on your phone to read your ballot if you're unable to see it. The photo must be deleted before you leave the polling place.
- Any voter who is disabled or over the age of 75 and requires assistance in voting may vote immediately without having to wait in line.
- If you have a disability and don't need assistance, you can still move to the front of the line if you arrive between 9:30am and 4:30pm.

Voting as a New Citizen

Naturalized citizens have the same right to vote as citizens born in the United States. VoteRiders, a nonpartisan organization focused on voter-ID, recommends that new citizens:

- Update ID documents to be sure your citizen status is reflected accurately.
- Check your voter registration to ensure that you are registered (and then check again before your state's voter registration deadline).
- Familiarize yourself with the laws in your state that have to do with voting. Verify if language assistance is readily available.

Absentee voting or voting by mail

Vote by mail.

- Georgia does not require an excuse for absentee voting. Anyone can vote absentee.
- Voters must request their absentee ballot by October 23.
- In Georgia, an absentee ballot returned by mail must be received by 7 pm on November 3.
- You can request an absentee ballot here: georgia.gov/vote-absentee-ballot.
- Your absentee ballot can be hand-delivered to your county registrar's office or to a county drop box. Every county is required to have a minimum of one drop box (located indoors and available to voters during operating hours)



**PFLAG recommends that voters
request their absentee ballots as soon
as possible and get them in the
mailbox no later than Tuesday,
October 20.**

Early voting

Vote early.

- All registered voters in Georgia can vote early for any reason.
- You can find information about early voting locations in Georgia here: vote411.org/pflag
- Early voting begins in Georgia on October 13 and ends on October 30. Early voting takes place Monday-Friday as well as Saturday, October 17 and October 24. The hours and the availability of Sunday voting differ by county.
- Voters who plan to vote early in Georgia are required to have identification. Learn more here: sos.ga.gov/page/georgia-voter-identification-requirements



Voting on Election Day:

Vote on election day.

- Polls open in Georgia at 7am and close at 7pm on Tuesday, November 3.
- You can find information about the location of your polling place here:
vote411.org/pflag.
- If you arrive and are told you won't be allowed to vote:
 - Don't panic. Ask why, fix any problems, ask about same day registration, request a provisional ballot, etc.
 - Call 866-OUR-VOTE or 888-VE-Y-VOTA.
