



GOTV in Nebraska

First things first

Register to vote:

- Go to: vote411.org/pflag
 - Check your registration status
 - If you are not registered – REGISTER NOW.
 - Find information about who is eligible to vote in Nebraska
- When you register you will be asked for your current address and ID Number (driver's license, state ID, or social security number).
- The voter registration deadline in Nebraska is Friday, October 16 (postmarked and online) and Friday, October 23 (in-person).



Voter Identification

In Nebraska, photo IDs are required to cast a ballot.

- If you do not have a state ID, you may obtain a free state ID for voting purposes from the Nebraska DMV. If a voter has a reasonable impediment that prevents them from obtaining a photo ID, they can complete a Reasonable Impediment Certification.

Voting While Trans/Nonbinary

The state of Nebraska does not provide any specific guidance for trans and nonbinary voters. Here are a few recommendations from Advocates for Trans Equality:

- Bring valid ID and backups (voter registration card, utility bill)
- Share the #VotingWhileTrans guide with poll workers
- If needed, connect with a volunteer attorney on-site or call the National Election Protection Hotline (866-OUR-VOTE)
- Worst case, request and cast a provisional ballot and be sure to ask for follow-up instructions



Voting While Living With a Disability

- Every polling place will have an "ExpressVote," which offers audio, zoom, multi-language capability, and sip and puff compatibility.
- All polling places will have an accessible parking area, walkway and interior.
- If you need to sit, you can request a chair.
- Curbside voting is available.
- You can request assistance from an election worker, or from a support person of your choice. The person cannot be your employer or union representative.

Voting as a New Citizen

Naturalized citizens have the same right to vote as citizens born in the United States. VoteRiders, a nonpartisan organization focused on voter-ID, recommends that new citizens:

- Update ID documents to be sure your citizen status is reflected accurately.
- Check your voter registration to ensure that you are registered (and then check again before your state's voter registration deadline).
- Familiarize yourself with the laws in your state that have to do with voting. Verify if language assistance is readily available.

Absentee voting or voting by mail

Vote by mail.

- Nebraska doesn't require an excuse for absentee voting.
- Voters must request their absentee ballot by 6 pm October 23.
- In Nebraska, an absentee ballot must be received by 7 pm MT/8 pm CT on November 3.

- Your absentee ballot cannot be hand delivered to your polling place on election day. It must be mailed, placed in a drop box, or returned to the county election official's office.

Early voting

Vote early.

- All registered voters in Nebraska can vote early for any reason.
- You can vote early at your county election offices. You can find information about early voting locations in Nebraska here: vote411.org/pflag
- Early voting begins in Nebraska on October 5 and ends on November 2.
- Voters who plan to vote early in Nebraska are required to have identification. Learn more here: sos.nebraska.gov/elections/voter-id



Getting Out The Vote

Voting on Election Day:

Vote on election day.

- Polls open in Nebraska at 7am MT/ 8am CT and close at 7pm MT/ 8pm CT on Tuesday, November 3.

- If you arrive and are told you won't be allowed to vote:
 - Don't panic. Ask why, fix any problems, ask about same day registration, request a provisional ballot, etc.
 - Call 866-OUR-VOTE or 888-VE-Y-VOTA.
