Voter Identification

In North Dakota, photo IDs are required to cast a ballot.

- North Dakota non-driver IDs are available at the Department of Transportation for no cost.
- Digital IDs available through NDDOT are not accepted for voting.

Voting While Trans/Nonbinary

The state of North Dakota does not provide any specific guidance for trans and nonbinary voters. Here are a few recommendations from Advocates for Trans Equality:

- Bring valid ID and backups (voter registration card, utility bill)
- Share the #VotingWhileTrans guide with poll workers
- If needed, connect with a volunteer attorney on-site or call the National Election Protection Hotline (866-OUR-VOTE)
- Worst case, request and cast a provisional ballot and be sure to ask for follow-up instructions



Voting While Living With a Disability

- The Express Vote is the accessible voting machine available to North Dakota voters with disabilities. You can learn more here:

- If a person with a disability doesn't have an ID, they can use an attester. The attester must provide identification and sign the absentee/mail ballot application form to attest to the person's residency and voting eligibility.
- Curbside voting is not available.

Voting as a New Citizen

Naturalized citizens have the same right to vote as citizens born in the United States. VoteRiders, a nonpartisan organization focused on voter-ID, recommends that new citizens:

- Update ID documents to be sure your citizen status is reflected accurately.
- Familiarize yourself with the laws in your state that have to do with voting. Verify if language assistance is readily available.

Absentee voting or voting by mail

Vote by mail.

- North Dakota does not require an excuse for absentee voting.
- In vote by mail counties all voting age residents are mailed an absentee ballot application (not a ballot). Voters in counties that are not vote by mail can apply for an absentee ballot here: sos.nd.gov/elections/voter/voting-north-dakota/how-do-i-vote/absentee-voting
- Voters must request their absentee ballot by November 2.
- Absentee ballots must be received before polls close on November 3.
- Your absentee ballot cannot be hand delivered to your polling place on election day. Ballots must be returned by mail, in person to your appropriate election official before polls close on November 3.

Early Voting

Vote early.

- All registered voters in North Dakota can vote early for any reason, if their county offers early voting.
- Early voting dates and hours vary by county. Visit vip.sos.nd.gov/Precincts.aspx?eid=346 to find out if, when, and where you can vote early in your county.

- Voters who plan to vote early in North Dakota are required to have identification. They will also be asked three questions by poll workers to confirm that they are eligible to vote in North Dakota.



Voting on Election Day:

Vote on election day.

- Polls open in North Dakota between 7am to 9am and close at between 7pm to 9pm on Tuesday, November 3. All polling locations must be open 9am to 7pm local time.

- If you arrive and are told you won't be allowed to vote:
 - Don't panic. Ask why, fix any problems, ask about same day registration, request a provisional ballot, etc.
 - Call 866-OUR-VOTE or 888-VE-Y-VOTE
