



GOTV in Utah

First things first

Register to vote.

- Go to: vote411.org/pflag
 - Check your registration status
 - If you are not registered – REGISTER NOW.
 - Find information about who is eligible to vote in Utah
- When you register online you will be asked for your current address and ID Number (driver's license, state ID, or social security number). Proof of citizenship is also required to vote in state elections.
- The voter registration deadline in Utah is October 23.



**You can register to vote in-person at your
voting center during early voting and on
Election Day in Utah.**

Voter Identification

In Utah, photo IDs are required to cast a ballot.

- If registering to vote on election day, you'll need to provide two acceptable forms of ID to verify identity and residence.
- If you do not have a valid, unexpired, photo ID you can provide two forms of ID (Learn more: vote.utah.gov/voter-id-requirements)

Voting While Trans/Nonbinary

The state of Utah does not provide any specific guidance for trans and nonbinary voters. Here are a few recommendations from Advocates for Trans Equality:

- Bring valid ID and backups (voter registration card, utility bill)
- Share the #VotingWhileTrans guide with poll workers
- If needed, connect with a volunteer attorney on-site or call the National Election Protection Hotline (866-OUR-VOTE)
- Worst case, request and cast a provisional ballot and be sure to ask for follow-up instructions



Voting While Living With a Disability

- In Utah, voters with disabilities may vote by mail or via email. You may request an email ballot through your county clerk's office.
- All voting locations will be wheelchair accessible and offer at least accessible voting machine. The machines offer accommodations for voters who have visual or hearing disabilities.
- Curbside voting is not available.
- You can request assistance from an election worker, or from a support person of your choice. The person cannot be your employer or union representative.

Voting as a New Citizen

Naturalized citizens have the same right to vote as citizens born in the United States. VoteRiders, a nonpartisan organization focused on voter-ID, recommends that new citizens:

- Update ID documents to be sure your citizen status is reflected accurately.
- Check your voter registration to ensure that you are registered (and then check again before your state's voter registration deadline).
- Familiarize yourself with the laws in your state that have to do with voting. Verify if language assistance is readily available.

Absentee voting or voting by mail

Vote by mail.

- All registered voters in Utah will automatically receive a ballot in the mail.
- In Utah, an absentee ballot must be received by the clerk's office by 8pm on November 3.
- You can also return the ballots to drop boxes or at a Voting Center until 8pm on November 3.
- Your absentee ballot can be hand delivered to a voting center on election day.

Early Voting

Vote early.

- All registered voters in Utah can vote early for any reason.
- You can find information about early voting locations in Utah here: vote411.org/pflag
- The date that early voting begins and ends in Utah varies by county. It may begin as early as October 20 and counties may offer a minimum of four days. Voters are encouraged to check their county election office's website for additional information.
- Voters who plan to vote early in Utah are required to have identification. Learn more here: vote.utah.gov/voter-id-requirements/



Voting on Election Day:

Vote on election day.

- Polls open in Utah at 7am and close at 8pm on Tuesday, November 3.
- You can find information about the location of your polling place here:

- If you arrive and are told you won't be allowed to vote:
 - Don't panic. Ask why, fix any problems, ask about same day registration, request a provisional ballot, etc.
 - Call 866-OUR-VOTE or 888-VE-Y-VOTA.
