First things first

Register to vote.

- Go to: vote411.org/pflag
 - Check your registration status
 - If you are not registered – REGISTER NOW. You cannot register online in Wyoming.
 - Find information about who is eligible to vote in Wyoming

- The voter registration deadline in Wyoming by mail is October 19.



**You can register to vote in-person at your
polling place during early voting and on
Election Day in Wyoming.**

Voter Identification

In Wyoming, photo IDs are required register to vote and to cast a ballot in person.

- If you do not have an acceptable photo ID, you can get a free WY identification card from your local Driver Services office.

Voting While Trans/Nonbinary

The state of Wyoming does not provide any specific guidance for trans and nonbinary voters. Here are a few recommendations from Advocates for Trans Equality:

- Bring valid ID and backups (voter registration card, utility bill)
- Share the #VotingWhileTrans guide with poll workers
- If needed, connect with a volunteer attorney on-site or call the National Election Protection Hotline (866-OUR-VOTE)
- Worst case, request and cast a provisional ballot and be sure to ask for follow-up instructions

Voting While Living With a Disability

- The Wyoming Secretary of State does not (currently) provide guidance online for people with disabilities.
- In accordance with ADA and HAVA, all polling places in Wyoming must be accessible must allow you to bring your service animal.
- Every polling place in Wyoming is equipped with an ExpressVote system. It features touchscreens, large text, high-contrast modes, and audio-ballot options with headphones for those with visual impairments.
- Curbside voting is available in Wyoming. By request, two election judges will bring your ballot to the curb.
- Voters with disabilities are able to vote from home with an absentee ballot.

Voting as a New Citizen

Naturalized citizens have the same right to vote as citizens born in the United States. VoteRiders, a nonpartisan organization focused on voter-ID, recommends that new citizens:

- Update ID documents to be sure your citizen status is reflected accurately.
- Check your voter registration to ensure that you are registered (and then check again before your state's voter registration deadline).
- Familiarize yourself with the laws in your state that have to do with voting. Verify if language assistance is readily available.

Absentee voting or voting by mail

Vote by mail.

- Wyoming does not require an excuse for absentee voting.
- Voters must request their absentee ballot by November 2.
- In Wyoming, an absentee ballot must be received by 7pm on November 3.
- You can request an absentee ballot by phone, email, mail, in person, or online. You can find more information here: sos.wyo.gov/elections/state/absenteevoting.aspx
- Your absentee ballot cannot be hand delivered to your polling place on election day. You must return it via mail or hand deliver to your county clerk's office.



**PFLAG recommends that voters
request their absentee ballots as soon
as possible and get them in the
mailbox no later than Tuesday,
October 20.**

Early Voting

Vote early.

- All registered voters in Wyoming can vote early for any reason.
- You can find information about early voting locations in Wyoming here: vote411.org/pflag
- Early voting begins in Wyoming on October 6 and ends on November 2.
- In-person early voting takes place at the County Clerk's Office. The dates and times it is available varies by county.
- Voters who plan to vote early in Wyoming are required to have identification. Learn more here: sos.wyo.gov/Elections/VoterID/



Voting on Election Day:

Vote on election day.

- Polls open in Wyoming at 7am and close at 7pm on Tuesday, November 3.
- You can find information about the location of your polling place here:
vote411.org/pflag
- If you arrive and are told you won't be allowed to vote:
 - Don't panic. Ask why, fix any problems, ask about same day registration, request a provisional ballot, etc.
 - Call 866-OUR-VOTE or 888-VE-Y-VOTA.
