

Get Out the Vote in Connecticut



The voter registration deadline in Connecticut, for the November 2026 election, is Friday, October 16 (by mail).

ID Requirements

In Connecticut, identification is required to cast a ballot.

First-time voters who registered by mail or who are voting for the first time in an election with federal candidates are required to provide photo ID. If they do not have photo ID they may cast a provisional ballot.

Non-photo ID with the voter's name and address or name and signature is sufficient for most voters, if they do not have a photo ID. Without any form of identification, voters may complete Form ED-681 stating that they are the elector that appears on the official checklist.

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Absentee Voting

As of 2026, voters in Connecticut no longer need to provide a specific reason or excuse to request an absentee ballot.

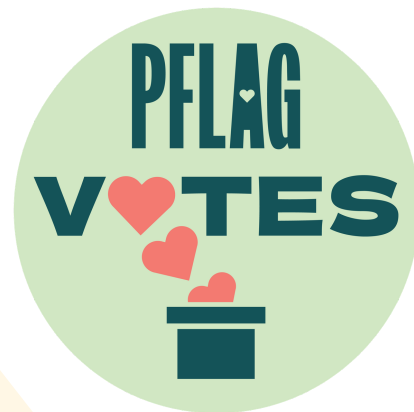
They must request their ballot by Monday, November 2.

Ballots must be received by 8pm on election by mail, in-person at the Town Clerk's office, or at a secure drop box located outside of town hall.

Early Voting

All registered voters in Connecticut can vote early for any reason. Early voting begins in Connecticut on Monday, October 19 and ends on Sunday, November 1.

Voting on Election Day

Polls open in Connecticut at 6 am and close at 8 pm on Tuesday, November 3.
