

# Get Out the Vote in Hawai'i



**The voter registration deadline in Hawai'i, for the November 2026 election, is October 26 (by mail) and Tuesday, November 3 (online and in-person).**



## ID Requirements

In Hawai'i, photo ID (e.g., driver license, military ID, passport) is not required to register and cast a ballot. Voters may be asked for an ID to help expedite the check-in process, but it is not required to vote.

## Absentee Voting

All registered voters in Hawai'i will receive a mail-in ballot on or around October 16.

The last day to request that a ballot be sent to an alternate address is October 27.

Absentee ballots must be received by 7 pm on Tuesday, November 3.

Your absentee ballot can be returned by mail or in person at a voter service center or drop box during early voting and on election day.

PFLAG recommends that voters request their absentee ballots as soon as possible and get them in the mailbox no later than Tuesday, October 20.

## In-Person Absentee Voting

All registered voters in Hawai'i can vote early for any reason. Early voting begins on Tuesday, October 20 and ends at 12 pm on Monday, November 2.

## Voting on Election Day

Polls open in Hawai'i at 7 am and close at 7 pm on Tuesday, November 3.
