

Get Out the Vote in Indiana



The voter registration deadline in Indiana, for the November 2026 election, is Monday, October 5.



ID Requirements

In Indiana, photo ID (e.g., driver license, military ID, passport) is required to register and cast a ballot. Voters who do not have a photo ID may cast a provisional ballot. Voters who complete a provisional ballot have until noon 10 days after the election to provide the necessary documentation or affirm they have an exemption for their vote to be counted.

Absentee Voting

Voters in Indiana with a valid excuse may vote absentee.

They must request their ballot by 11:59pm Thursday, October 22.

Absentee ballot applications must include the voter's voter ID number or a photocopy of their ID.

Absentee ballots must be received by 6 pm on Tuesday, November 3.

PFLAG recommends that voters request their absentee ballots as soon as possible and get them in the mailbox no later than Tuesday, October 20.

In-Person Absentee Voting

All registered voters in Indiana can vote in-person absentee for any reason. In-person absentee voting begins on Tuesday, October 6 and ends at 12 pm on Monday, November 2. All Indiana counties must make in-person absentee voting available on Saturday, October 24 and Saturday, October 31.

Voting on Election Day

Polls open in Indiana at 6 am and close at 6 pm on Tuesday, November 3.

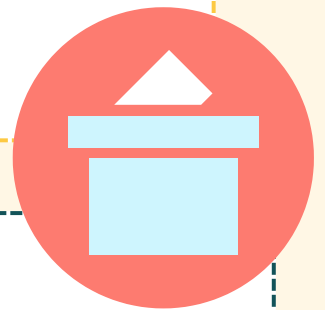
