**The voter registration deadline in Kansas,
for the November 2026 election,
is Tuesday, October 13.**



ID Requirements

In Kansas, photo ID (e.g., driver license, military ID, passport) is required to cast a ballot. Voters who do not have a photo ID can apply for a free non-driver identification card with the Kansas DMV.

Absentee Voting

Kansas does not require an excuse for absentee voting.

Voters must request their absentee ballot by Tuesday, October 27.

A 3-day grace period, which requires mail ballots be postmarked by November 3 and received by November 5 has recently been upheld by the Kansas Supreme Court. However, voters are strongly encouraged to ensure that their absentee ballots, sent by mail, are received by 7 pm on Tuesday, November 3.

Your absentee ballot can be hand delivered on election day to any polling place in your county. If you drop it off in-person, it must be received by the time the polls close on election day.

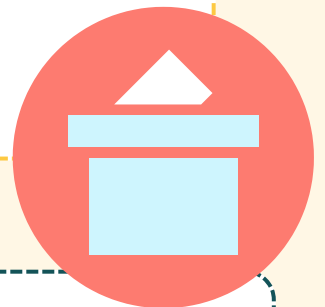
Early Voting

All registered voters in Kansas can vote early for any reason. Early voting locations must open by Tuesday, October 27 and all locations close at 12 pm on Monday, November 2. Some counties begin voting as early as Wednesday, October 14. Check with your local election office.

Voting on Election Day

Polls open in Kansas at 7 am and close at 7 pm on Tuesday, November 3.
