The voter registration deadline in Massachusetts, for the November 2024 election, is Saturday, October 26.

ID Requirements

In Massachusetts, identification may be required to register and cast a ballot. You may need to show identification before voting if you're voting for the first time, if you're on the inactive voter list, or if the poll worker has a "practical and legal reason" to ask.



Absentee Voting

All registered voters are eligible for no-excuse voting by mail. Voters will receive an application for their mail ballot in September.

If you need your ballot sent to a temporary mailing address, you must submit an absentee ballot application.

Mail and absentee ballots must be requested by 5 pm Tuesday, October 27.

Mail and absentee ballots must be received by 8 pm on November 3.

You cannot drop your ballot off at a polling place on election day. You must mail it back, hand deliver it to your local election office, drop it off at an early voting location during early voting hours, or use a ballot drop box.

Early Voting

All registered voters in Massachusetts can vote early for any reason. Early voting begins on Saturday, October 17 and ends on Friday, October 30. The early voting schedule is set by local election officials.

Voting on Election Day

Polls open in Massachusetts at 7 am and close at 8 pm on Tuesday, November 3. Some towns may open the polls as early as 5:45 am.

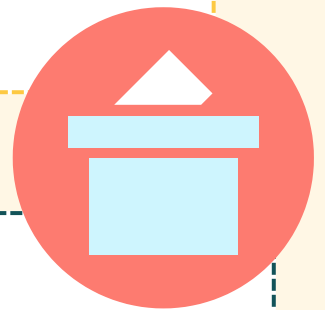
