

Get Out the Vote in New York



The voter registration deadline in New York, for the November 2026 election, is Saturday, October 24.



ID Requirements

In New York, identification is required to register, but not to cast a ballot. If you're a first-time voter who did not provide identification with your mail registration, you can provide ID at the polls or vote by affidavit ballot.

Absentee Voting

All registered New York voters can request an early mail ballot. Absentee ballots are still available, and require an excuse.

Early mail and absentee voters must request their ballot by Saturday, October 24 if requesting by mail. The deadline is Monday, November 2 if requesting in person.

Ballots must be received by Tuesday, November 3 if returning in person. Ballots must be postmarked by Tuesday, November 3 if returning by mail.

Your early mail or absentee ballot can be hand delivered on election day.

All registered voters in New York can vote early for any reason. Early voting begins on Saturday, October 24 and ends on Saturday, November 1.

Voting on Election Day

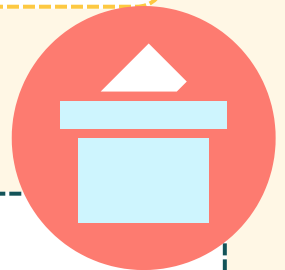
Polls open in New York at 6 am and close at 9 pm on Tuesday, November 3.
