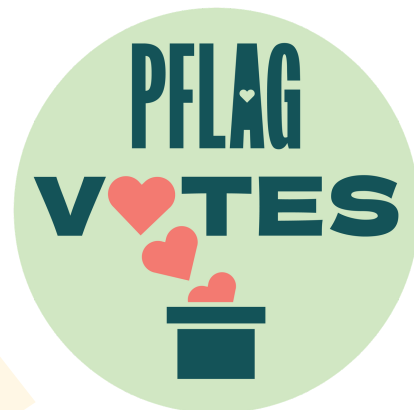




Get Out the Vote in Oklahoma



**The voter registration deadline in Oklahoma,
for the November 2026 election,
is Friday, October 9.**



ID Requirements

In Oklahoma, photo ID (e.g., driver license, military ID, passport) is required to cast a ballot. The free Voter ID Card sent to voters after they register is considered valid proof of identity, even though it does not include a picture. If you do not have or refuse to show proof of identity, you may vote a provisional ballot and sign a sworn affidavit.

Absentee Voting

Oklahoma does not require an excuse for absentee voting.

Voters must request their absentee ballot by Monday, October 19.

Absentee ballots must be received by close of business Monday, November 2 if dropping off in person. The ballot must be received by 7pm on Tuesday, November 3 if returning by mail.

There are several different types of absentee ballots in Oklahoma. Each type has its own specific instructions for requesting, completing, and returning the ballot.

Oklahoma requires proof of identity and a notarized signature on all “standard” absentee ballots. Notaries may not charge a fee to notarize an absentee ballot.

Early Voting

All registered voters in Oklahoma can vote early for any reason. Early voting is available in Oklahoma from 8am-6 pm on October 28, 29, 30 and from 8am-2pm on Saturday, October 31

Voting on Election Day

Polls open in Oklahoma at 7 am and close at 7 pm on Tuesday, November 5.
