**The voter registration deadline in Oregon,
for the November 2026 election,
is Tuesday, October 13.**



ID Requirements

In Oregon, photo ID is required to register, but not to cast a ballot. If a voter does not have an Oregon ID, they can still register online. However, they will have to print a voter registration card and deliver it to their county elections office.

Absentee Voting

Oregon is an all vote-by-mail state.

All registered Oregon voters will receive their voters' pamphlets and ballots in the mail two to three weeks before the election.

Voters who will be away from their primary residence during that time can request an absentee ballot be sent to a temporary mailing address.

Absentee ballots must be received by 8 pm on Tuesday, November 3.

Your absentee ballot can be returned by mail, dropped off at an official drop box, or dropped off at a county election office.

Voters who wish to vote in person can do so at their county elections office. Contact your county elections office and the county clerk to learn more.

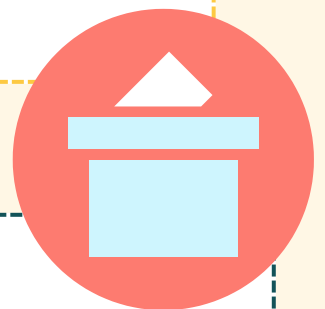
