

Get Out the Vote in Pennsylvania



The voter registration deadline in Pennsylvania, for the November 2026 election, is Monday, October 19.



ID Requirements

In Pennsylvania, identification is not required to cast a ballot unless it is your first time voting at a polling place. If you do not have photo ID, you can use another ID that includes your name and address, including a current utility bill or bank statement.

Absentee Voting

Pennsylvania does not require an excuse to vote by mail.

The deadline to request a mail-in or absentee ballot is 5 pm on Tuesday, October 27.

Absentee ballots must be received by 8 pm on Tuesday, November 3.

All voters, except those with disabilities, must return their own ballot.

Your absentee ballot cannot be hand delivered to your polling place on election day. You must return it via mail, at a drop box, or at your county election office.

Early Voting

All registered voters in Pennsylvania can vote early for any reason. The date that early voting begins in Pennsylvania varies by county and is largely dependent on when ballots are finalized and available. Voters are encouraged to check their county's website for additional information.

Voting on Election Day

Polls open in Pennsylvania at 7am and close at 8pm on Tuesday, November 3.

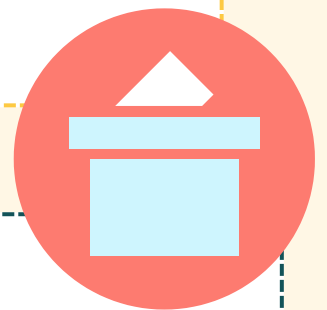
