**The voter registration deadline in Utah,
for the November 2026 election,
is Friday, October 23.**



ID Requirements

In Utah, photo ID or two forms of non-photo ID that combine to prove your identity and current address are required to cast a ballot in person. If you plan to register to vote in-person during early voting or on election day, you'll need to provide two forms of ID to verify your identity and current address.

Proof of citizenship is required to register to vote in state elections

Absentee Voting

All registered voters in Utah will automatically receive a ballot in the mail.

In Utah, an absentee ballot must be received by the clerk's office by 8pm on November 3. You can also return the ballots to drop boxes until 8pm on November 3.

Your absentee ballot can be hand delivered to your polling place on election day.

PFLAG recommends that voters get their ballots in the mailbox no later than Tuesday, October 20.

Early Voting

All registered voters in Utah can vote early for any reason. Early voting begins as early as Tuesday, October 20 and counties must offer a minimum of four days. Contact your county clerk for your county's specific dates, hours, and locations.

Voting on Election Day

Polls open in Utah at 7am and close at 8pm on Tuesday, November 3.

You can register to vote at your polling place on election day. You will be required to provide two forms of ID.
