

Get Out the Vote in Wisconsin



The voter registration deadline in Wisconsin, for the November 2026 election, is Wednesday, October 14.

ID Requirements

In Wisconsin, photo ID (e.g., driver license, military ID, passport) is required to cast a ballot. Free state ID cards are available.



Absentee Voting

Wisconsin does not require an excuse for absentee voting.

Voters must request their ballot by Thursday, October 29.

Absentee ballots must be received by 8 pm on Tuesday, November 3. It can be mailed, hand-delivered to the Municipal Clerk's office or another designated location during the early voting period, or hand delivered to a voter's assigned polling place on election day

PFLAG recommends that voters request their absentee ballots as soon as possible and get them in the mailbox no later than Tuesday, October 20.

Early Voting

All registered voters in Wisconsin can vote early for any reason. Early voting begins on Tuesday, October 20 and ends on Sunday, November 1. Dates and locations that early voting is available vary by county.

Voting on Election Day

Polls open in Wisconsin at 7 am and close at 8 pm on Tuesday, November 3.
